

# Discover Your Working Style

A lesson on discovering what environments you work best in

Grades: 6 - 12		Subject: Multiple	Topic: Career
<b>Lesson Summary:</b>  Students will discuss how people can have different work style preferences. Next, students will participate in an activity that allows them to consider how they work best and what they might look for in a future work environment. Last, students will use CareerVillage as a way to discover if the jobs they are interested in align with their working styles.  ***Students will need to already be signed up to CareerVillage in order to complete this activity***			
<b>Materials Needed:</b>  <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Student worksheet attached to this lesson</li><li>2. Student wifi device to access CareerVillage.org</li></ol>		<b>Learning Objective:</b>  Students will increase awareness of their own personal working style and research how they may align with certain career paths.	

## Lesson Structure

<b>Hook</b> <b>15 mins</b>	<p><b>SAY:</b> <i>Knowing when, where, and how you work best is extremely important for setting yourself up for success. In order to begin understanding this, we are going to start off today's lesson with a game of would you rather. In this game we'll debate preferences for working styles at school.</i></p> <p><b>DO:</b> Instruct students to stand in the middle of the room. Read each "would you rather" prompt and designate which side of the room they should stand on based on their choice. Once students have picked a side, ask one or two students to explain why they chose that option.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Would you rather do a group project or independent project?</li><li>• Would you rather take remote classes or in person classes?</li><li>• Would you rather have to take a timed exam or have two weeks to work on a term paper?</li><li>• Would you rather go on a field trip that has everything planned out or be able to have lots of free time to explore and discover on your own?</li></ul> <p><b>Reflection Question done in small groups or written:</b> What did you learn about yourself through this activity? What questions were easy for you to decide? Which ones were more difficult?</p>
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**Class Activity**  
**20 minutes**

**SAY:** This activity reveals things about your personal working style. Everyone has different personal preferences on how we like to get things done, spend our time and how we communicate.

These preferences become important when thinking about what job you would like to have one day.

When thinking about potential career paths, it is important to consider not only what you want to do but also **when**, **where** and **how** you prefer to work. You want to consider what elements of a work environment make you feel happy and motivated, and this will help you discern what jobs could be a good fit for you. .

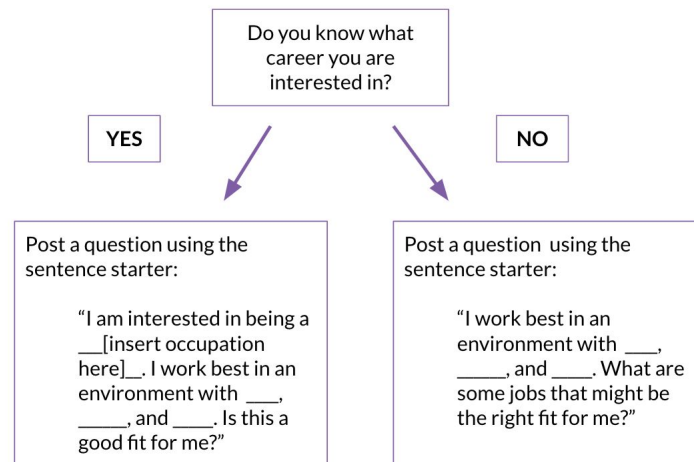
**DO:** Students will complete a worksheet where they are asked to think about their preference for different working styles. Then they will be tasked with narrowing down their list to 3 top things they would look for in a job.
